

From the VFW Post 1008 Color/Honor Guard:






Our team has sacrificed family time on a regular basis to give the Vet (his/hers) the Honors they deserve. "THANK YOU TEAM!"

















Even the we were closed we got some work done!!!!

Service Officer Letter:



During the months of November and December, I had contact with 8 veterans or family members of veterans inquiring on a range of subjects regarding VA benefits.

With the current state of the Covid-19 pandemic, it has been difficult to coordinate efforts on their behalf. The State Service Office has been closed as well as the Oakland County Veterans office and our own post. The State Service Officer was stricken with the virus and down for a time but is now back at work helping veterans with their claims.

I have been utilizing social media (Facebook) to post public service announcements with some success. I opened a new email, dedicated to my Service Officer position (corpsmanup0311@yahoo.com) in an effort to reach more veterans without burdening the post with SO business.

The VA has an online page where you can attempt to navigate forms to file your claims. I would strongly suggest you discuss your intentions to file with a Service Officer before submitting a claim direct.

I want to thank our Commander Mark Woods for assisting a family prior to Thanksgiving by providing them a wheelchair so the husband could be home for the holidays. Being with family is even more important during these times.

Recently a Korean veteran was looking for assistance to modify his bathroom, as entering and exiting the tub was becoming difficult. I sent him a form 10-0103 from the VA that affords financial assistance for home improvements, alterations, and modifications. If you need this type of modification contact me for information.

I also received a call from a veteran looking to get a service animal. The VA does not provide this service but you can contact the VA for counseling, where they can refer you to other organizations. If you qualify for an animal, they will pay for certain veterinarian services.

Remember, if you think you need help, call me or a service officer from any service organization. We will attempt to help you navigate the system.




