NATIONAL LEAGUE OF POW/MIA FAMILIES

The National League of POW/MIA Families reported in their November 22, 2019 update that there are still 72,638 Americans unaccounted from World War II, 7,605 from the Korean War, 1,587 from the Vietnam War, 126 from the Cold War, 5 from the Gulf Wars and 1 from Operation El Dorado

Canyon for a total of 81,962. Of that number over 40,000 were deep sea, large ship losses. They also report that the total Americans accounted for since the end of the Vietnam War (1975) is 996. In addition they report that 41 ID's have been made on remains that came out of North Korea in the 55

flag-draped transfer cases.







way to handle his numerous paddles And he won stuff too!! Thanks to all who participated and especially to those who put in lots of hours planning and organizing this annual event!.












VA announces proposal to increase access to dental care

WASHINGTON – Today the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) announced it has submitted to Congress a waiver request and pilot program under Section 152 of the VA Maintaining Internal Systems and Strengthening Integrated Outside Networks Act of 2018 (MISSION Act) to improve access to dental care for Veterans.

The MISSION Act authorizes VA to submit statutory waivers to Congress for the purpose of testing innovative service delivery models to improve the quality of care for America's Veterans. Under existing statute, VA has limited authority to provide dental services for Veterans. With this waiver request, VA is submitting a proposal to increase access to dental services for enrolled Veterans ineligible for dental services through VA by connecting them with community-based, pro bono or discounted dental service providers. **See va.gov for more information


